The evidence in support of your claim, under the act of June 7, 1832, has been examined, and the papers are herewith returned. The following is a statement of your case in a tabular form. Personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid Mary Davis a resident of the County of said County of Logan aged 50 years and personally well known to me who being duly sworn according to law declared that she is the widow of William Davis deceased who was a Private Soldier in the Company Commanded by Captain Lambert in the Regiment of Regulars

Commanded by _____ in the Revolutionary War that her said husband was drafted _____ or enlisted _____ on or about the _____ day of _____ A.D. 177_____ for the term of _____ and continued in actual service in said War for the term of _____ and was honorably discharged at _____

_____ on the _____ day of _____ 177_____. She further states that she was married to the said William Davis in the County of Floyd State of Kentucky on the 25th day of March 1819 by one Ruben Giddens a Justice of the Peace and that her name before her said marriage was Mary Taylor and her said husband died in the said County of Logan on the 23rd day of May 1842 that she has remained a widow ever since and is still a widow. She has never before made application for a Pension. But the said William Davis was a Pensioner in his life time for several years before his death she thinks he drew ~~about \$80~~ _____ a year ~~from the Pension~~ _____

She makes this declaration in order to obtain
the benefit of the provisions of the act of Congress
passed the 3rd of February 1853. Allowing Perquisite
and for further evidence in this behalf she
refers to the Muster Rolls of the Company in which
her name ~~has been~~ served and to the Papers in
File at the Department that were ~~sent~~ by her
when she drew her Pension, among which her original
Certificate of discharge may (perhaps) be found.
The Certificate of Pension granted to her said husband
was dated the 23rd of May 1855. at the War Department.

On the 17th day of September 1832, personally
appeared before the Court of Logan County, William Davis, a Citizen
now living on the line of this County on the Kentucky side of Gasbun
but nearest the Courthouse of Logan, aged Eighty five years, who
being first duly sworn, said by & said Davis hath said make
the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the pro-
visions made by the Act of Congress passed on the 7th of June
1832 that he entered into the Army of the United States about the
Commencement of the War of our Revolution and previous to the
passing of Gen. Gage at Boston. He served in the Company of Capt.
Madison in the 9th Co. Regiment, which Regt. was then Com-
manded by Col. Davis. He joined the main Army, Commanded by Gen.
Wayne at Chatafield. Artillery in the 2nd mounted
Regiment. Shortly after Col. Madison was dismissed & a Capt.
Fields appointed to Command the Company, in whose Company
he continued during the period of his indentments which was
for 8 years, & was discharged at Winchester. Shortly after he
was drafted for 18 months, and served in the 1st Regt. Commanded
by Col. Gistings and under the Command of Gen. Morgan
was with the Army at the Storming of the Redoubt & was
at the battle of Bunker Hill, after his term of service expired
for the 18 months. He again enlisted under Col. Gistings, the
Captains name forgotten and continued with the army till
the unfortunate conclusion of the War at the Siege of York, where he
served as he believes under Gen. Wayne, that being very near
his morning may have deceased him, he never received any
pension: nor has he yet received his land bounty - sworn to
and subscribed the day & year aforesaid. William Davis

of February last a Resident of the County of Logan
State of Virginia who being duly sworn ac-
cording to Law declares that she is the widow of
William Davis Died who was a pensioner of
the United States under the act of Congress grant-
ing pensions to soldiers for Revolutionary Services
and that he drew his pension up to the time of
his death and as his widow she has rec^d open-
sion Certificate under the 3rd section of the act
of February 3rd 1853 for eighty dollars per annu-
dated the 19th day of September 1853 for proof
of her marriage with said William Davis his
services - death &c. She refers to the proof now on
file upon which her husband & herself was
pensioned she states that she does not recollect
the precise time & date of her marriage with the
said William Davis but that they was married
in the County of Floyd State of Kentucky by one
Nathan Giddings or Gidsons that her name
before her said marriage was Mary Taylor and
that her said husband died in the County of
Logan State of Virginia on the 23rd day of
May 1849 as well as she now recollects and that
she is still a widow.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining
the Bounty land which she may be entitled under
the act of Congress approved the 3rd March 1856.
