This Arms and Crest, with differences and variations for branch is recorded for many lines of the name Casteel in England. The name was origonally Castle as Castles are used in this Arms. John-Henry Casteel, the eldest son of Sir James D. Casteel, survived his father as a Baronet in 1682. Authority "Burkes General Armory 1844".

John Harrison Casteel, son of John Casteel, Sr., Virginia Militia 1775–1780, half-blood Cherokee Indian, born in Greenbriar County, Virginia, now West Virginia, in 1778. John, Sr., followed Boone to Kentucky in 1780 (circa). John Harrison came to Kentucky over the Boone Trace in 1795. He married Elon Metcalf in Knox County, now Laurel County, Kentucky in 1805. He served as a private (scout) for Andrew Jackson in the war with the Creek Indians in Tennessee and Georgia. He served as a scout for Governor Shelby and Col. William Whitney at the Battle of the Thames, when the great Indian Chief Tecumseh was killed.

John Harrison and Elon settled on White Oak Branch, a tributary of the Rockcastle River, is now North Laurel County. Family tradition has related that Elon's father, John Metcalf, Sr., erected the first cabin as a dwelling place in what is now Laurel County and that John H. Casteel, with the help of his father-in-law, erected the second cabin as a dwelling place. A Mr. Woods (some doubt as to his correct name) erected the first log structure on Hazel Patch Creek for use as a tavern and Inn for the Boone Trace travelers. This structure was just north of our present Hazel Green High School.

To the union of John H. and Elon Metcalf Casteel were born the following children:

1. Rebecca, born 1806 married Albert Searcy. Descendants unknown to writer.

2. Hiram, born 1808 married Sarah (Sally) Seaborn. He was one of Laurel Counties first teachers and he was also a Baptist preacher. He died in Missouri in 1880. Mary Casteel Lynn of Princeton, Missouri and Anna Lee Goin of Jefferson, Oregon are descendants. A daughter, Calista, married Marcus Lindsey Robinson, a grandson of Jonathon McNeill.

3. Polly, born 1810 married Rueben Gabbard. Charlie Gabbard of London, Kentucky and Everett King of Gray Hawk, Kentucky are descendants.

4. Jane (Jennie) born 1812 married John Rader, Sr., former county judge of Jackson County, Kentucky. Herman Rader of Egypt, Kentucky and Daniel Boone Rader of Teges, Kentucky are both descendants.

5. John Casteel II, born 1814 married Nancy Black, a grand-daughter of Titus Mershon. John was a trapper-hunter, and one of the first settlers of Jackson County, Kentucky. (Taken from Collins History of Kentucky) Jesse L. Casteel of McKee, Kentucky and Rebecca Ellen Rader of Red House Road, Richmond, Kentucky are descendants.

6. James, born 1816 married Elizabeth Wild, was a lawyer and farmer. C.A. Casteel, James A. (Bert) Casteel and J.R. Moberly are descendants.

7. Norris, born 1818 married Lockey Wild, sister to Elizabeth Wild, was a farmer. Elmer Quinlan, Earnest Quinlan, and Ella Ouinlan Vance of East Bernstadt, Kentucky are descendants.

8. Lemuel, born 1820, farmer, first married Minerva A. Durham. His second wife was Henrietta Moberly (no relation to J.R. Moberly). Herbert and Arthur Casteel of Enterprise, Oregon, Roy Young, Jr. of Route 3, London, Kentucky, Shelby Hodge and Reverend Herman Bond of Symbol, Kentucky and Reverend Roy Brummitt of Mershon, Kentucky are all descendants.

9. Nathan, born 1822, farmer, married Eliza Jane Durham, sister to Lemuel's first wife. C.D. Ward and Lee Hurley of East Bernstadt, Kentucky are descendants.

10. George W., born 1824 married Almira Ballinger of Rockcastle County, Kentucky. He was a farmer and Civil War soldier who was imprisoned at Andersonville, Geirgia during the great rebellion and died of starvation. Jesse J. McHone of Berea, Kentucky, Richard Casteel of Big Hill, Kentucky and Nellie Casteel of Sand Gap, Kentucky are descendants. 11. David, born 1826, never married. He died December 1, 1849 during the war with Mexico.

12. Margaret (Peggy), born 1828 first married James Metcalf. They had two daughters and one son, John, a Civil War soldier who died or was killed during the war. Margaret's second husband was Richard Riggs. Robert F. Riggs of Route 4, London, Kentucky and Newt Riggs of East Bernstadt, Kentucky are descendants.

James Casteel, 6th. child of John H. and Elon Casteel, married Elizabeth Wild on March 12, 1837 at Manchester, Clay County, Kentucky. She died in 1862, but James lived until 1897. To this union were born the following children:

1. Ellen, born 1838, married Richard Wilson. They both died in Texas, but were the parents of thirteen children. The only living survivor is Mrs. T.H. (Ada) Eskridge, Tulsa, Oklahoma. She is 89 years old and a grand lady.

2. William M., born 1839 never married. He was a Civil War soldier who died in Libby Prison, Nashville, Tennessee on March 4, 1863.

3. Felix Wild, born 1841, was a farmer and Civil War veteran. His wife was Adaliza Jane Casteel. He was named for his grand-father, Felix Wild, who was a surgeon. Harry and Howard Casteel of Princeton, Missouri, and Annette Hoffman, a teacher from Trenton, Missouri are descendants.

4. David Weaver, born 1843 married Sabra Ann Allen, daughter of James Allen, Jonesboro, Tennessee. David was a farmer, and a wagon master during the Civil War.

5. John M., born 1845 married Emily Robinson, was a farmer. Descendants are living in Oklahoma.

6. Harrison R., born 1847 married Rachel Forbes, was a farmer. His wife, Rachel, was a relative of ex-Governor Faubus of Arkansas. James David Casteel and Cora Butler of Supulpa, Oklahoma are descendants. Cora is still living at the age of 93.

7. Rosanna, born 1849 married Elisha Wilson, who was a farmer. They both died in Oklahoma where many of their descendants are still living.

11. Clayborn White, born 1859, was a farmer and rancher, married Ellan Allen, a sister to his brother David's wife. They spent most of their life in the West. John Casteel of Lemon Grove, California and Joe Casteel of Jefferson City, Montana are living sons.
