I too believe there is a link in our Dixon + Hensley lineage.

I wrote for Nancy Dixon Hensley death certificate but deaths in Lawrence co begin in 1882.

We have Nancy Dixon + Milton Hensley marriage record. they were married 10 Oct 1847 Monroe co Ind.

Census of Lawrence co states Nancy born in Ky March 1826. Christopher C Hensley my grandfather was born 14 Feb 1850 Bedford Lawrence co Ind. Mother says he said his mother died when he was 3 months old.

One paper says 8 months (easily mistaken 3 for 8) in assuming she died in Lawrence co. Milton then married Lucy Hoodman (have marriage copy). Mother remembered her father (C C Hensley) talked about his grandma Peeler.

Mrs Betty L Jones, a Peeler researcher, with our knowledge helped us make the connection between Anna Head - Christopher Peeler - Christopher C Hensley.

Our heads, Peelers + Hensleys trace back to Scott Co Va. Since your Wm Dixon traveled from Scott Co to Monroe co could there have been a stop over in Ky? Do you have any census of Dixons in Monroe co Ind?

Karen Bowers is my cousin, I'll write her about the wrong Gilding Hensley. Was there a copy of some Hensley written by my mother (91 year old + good memory) in the files Karen sent to the library? I'll send you a copy if you wish. With this booklet by Eric Hensley Witham + my daughters research in genealogy - got me started digging.

I have James Hensley's children names but not their birth dates. Your information of court records cleared up our puzzle of Anna Head. Milton was born in 1826 + James married 1827.

I appreciate your help. Thank you

A Court held for Pennsylvania County on Monday August the 25th 1765. The last will and Testament of Samuel Hamley deceased being Exhibited into Court by Martha Hamley and John Hamley Executors therein named and proved by the oaths of Thomas Perry and Thomas Antiterior Witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded, and the said Executors took the usual oath and gave bond with Joseph Herndon and William Wood Sureties, for the due and faithful Execution of the said Decedent's Estate, and performance of his Will.
