authorized" John Hilton to take possession of his
James Hensley land which included the 61 acres of the
original land grant surveyed for Hensley in 1849, plus
Hensley's interests in the John Peters lands on the
south side of the river. Apparently this sale included
110 acres of Mann's 208 or more acres in the area.
Sale price was \$225.87, due in three annual payments
by Dec 25, 1874." (included ab 40 acres of John Peters
old estate.) mentions "the river bend which includes the
Hensley Grant" said "John Peters apparently settled on
this land prior to 1800. He is listed as deceased in the
Hensley grant in 1849-50. Hensley's grant was for 61
acres and was bordered by John Peters land to the
west and Samuel W. Hilton (1st cousin to John H.) land on
the north. We are reasonably certain that this land was
in the east bend of John's three bends in the river -
the one in which Blue Spring Creek joins the river. The
grant does not mention the creek but later events
indicate that Hensley's house was probably there.

It Apparently, John Peters died without leaving a will.
The division of the land among his heirs was not

accomplished until after 16 Oct 1856. — the date on which James Hensley sued the other heirs for a legal division. The court action was recorded as James Hensley and Ellen, his wife, complainants vs Michael Gabbard and others, defendants. Hensley's wife Ellen, was probably a daughter of John Peters. The court action was served on Ann and Jesse Peters (sister and brother) and an order against the other defendants "duly published and posted". Since all the defendants failed to appear and — in the words of the court — "answer the bill as to them is also taken for confessed". The court decree had two ^{"tracts"} of land mentioned in the bill as divided, one share share each to (1) complainants wife (2) Polly Gabbard (3) Susannah Hensley (4) Ann Peters (5) Rebecca Burgess (6) Salley Gabbard (possibly 'Gaherd') (7) Vina Millon (8) Catherine Ryan (9) Jesse Peters and (10) one share to Alfred and Matilda, children and heirs at law of Jacob Peters, deceased." [Court appointed commissioners to make partition of sd lands & report to next term of court — order amended 26 May 1858 to add name of John Peters as 11th heir] Direct evidence suggests J. A. Mann had purchased about 80 acrs adj. to Peters by time of 1856 court action

Hensley apparently bought Mann's land in 1858. We suspect 33 acres of it lay between Hensley's land grant and the river. Mann had added to his the land of Ann Peters. Mann also held a contract and 'title bond' executed by Jesse Peters for his share of the estate with the condition that Jesse could redeem the land at any time before 'finally conveyed'. With the sale of his land to Hensley, Mann assigned the Jesse Peters title bond with with the same condition of redemption to Hensley for \$10.00.

July 25, 1859 Hensley agreed to pay Peter \$15 for conveyance of the land. On 6 August, 1859, Jesse and his wife, Laurinda, appeared with Hensley before John Hickom, justice of the peace, and stated the above information plus Hensley's agreement to pay Mann \$10 plus interest. As was common in those days, Jesse's wife was examined privately and apart from her said husband by Hickom and James Boyer and she signed a statement that her decision was freely made without undue influence on the part of her husband. --- Apparently Jesse continued to live on the land since he was killed there by Union troops during the civil war. He probably did not sell all his inheritance to Hensley.

(Feb 10, 1866, Samuel Burgis and Rebecca, his wife and William Nelson (or Miller) and Laura (Vina) of Clay Co., Ky. signed a deed to John Wesley Hilton lots number 1, 2, 3, 9 and 12 as laid off by the Commissioners. lot no 2, the eastern lot, bordered on James Hensley's line. Two days later John W. ^{Hilton} Hensley added lot #10 in the same tract and lot No. 1 in the old Martinwood tract (adjacent to Hensley's land in a deed dated 12 Feb 1866 with Mathias Gabard & Sarah, his wife, of Owsley Co., Ky. on 14 Feb 1866 John W. Hilton added two more lots from Polly Gabbard of Brethett Co., Ky. These included lot No 6 in the old Martinwood tract and lot No 1 — in the bare tract etc etc

4) Soon after John Wesley (Hilton) acquired his interests in the western portions of the Peter lands, James Hensley lost his. Hensley may have over extended himself in the 1858 purchase from J. A. Mann. He failed to meet some condition of the sale and lost all the lands December 29, 1870. The

Original action, recorded as a 'deed' from James H. Shoemaker ('Trustee of the County of Scott, State of Virginia') to J. A. Mann tells the story better than we can relate it.

(quoting)

Whereas, a certain James Hensley of Scott Co., by a certain deed bearing date the 22nd of February in the year 1858 and recorded in the Clerk's Office of the county court of Scott Co. did give, grant, bargain and --- 'transfer was made to the county' --- and the deed continues --- 'the said James H. Shoemaker his heirs and assigns two certain tracts (tracts) or parcels of land and all the interest of said James Hensley in the lands of John Peters deceased lying and being in the county of Scott on the south fork of the Holston River and adjoining the lands of Samuel W. Hilton and others --- thereto belonging, in trust for the benefit of John A. Mann and by which deed the said James H. Shoemaker, was and were empowered: on the failure of James Hensley to perform certain deeds therein (therein) mentioned to sell the said property, or as much as thereof as shall be found necessary, to fulfill the purpose of the said trusts and provisions contained, and thereas the said James Hensley failed to perform the requirements contained in said deed, the said James H. Shoemaker in execution of the trust, as above made, did on the 11th day of October 1870, after giving 30 days notice of the time and place of sale by putting up and (an) advertisement for that purpose, for that space of time at the front door of the court house of the said county of Scott, expose to sell two tracts (tracts) of land and all interest in the said James Hensley

in the lands of John Peters, dec." The deed continued with acreages, coots etc.

Q All of Hensley's land had to be sold to cover the debt. And J. A. Mann was the highest bidder - paying \$300 for the 100 acre tract, \$101 for the 61 acre tract (Hensley's original grant) and \$30.56 $\frac{1}{4}$ for the interest in the Peters lands. Apparently, Hensley was still alive at the time of the sale. Possibly he was ill, or perhaps losing his lands also cost him his life. He was dead within a year and before Dec 13, 1871.

A Thirteen months after reclaiming Hensley's lands, J. A. Mann signed this statement. "I have contracted to and authorized John H. Hilton to take possession of all the land bought by me by virtue of a deed of trust executed by James Hensley to John Sheanavor and sold by said trustee so far as the sixty one acre tract and the interest of John Peters land on the south side of the river (with fork of the Holston) this 13th November 1871." One month later a deed was drawn between Hilton and Mann for the sale of 110 acres 1 rod and 16 poles. This included the Hensley land grant "and all the interest of James Hensley in the lands of John Peters dec. (except the interest in Martin B. Wood and John Peters tract of 48 acres) being $\frac{2}{3}$ shares as laid down in a plat of partition vis Ann Peters thirty acres, Ellen, wife of James Hensley, deceased, 7 acres, Jesse Peters three acres 3 rods and 16 poles and James Hensley in his own 7 acres and 2 rods." There is no record of how Mann came by shares of Ann Peters or how Hensley came by 7 acres "in his own right". For this land John H. Hilton agreed to pay \$225.80 in three notes, due 25 December, 1872, 1873, and 1874 bearing 6% interest. The first note was for \$100.

February 22, 1873, Mann appointed John H. Hilton to act for him in the settling the Dower lines of the remaining portion of his Hensley lands on the north side of the river on which Nelly (Ellen) Hensley, "now lives" and to make arrangements with her as to her Dower in the lands of her husband James Hensley, deceased. John Hilton was to take possession of the remaining land and rent it to Mann's best advantage. Apparently several possible divisions were considered for the widow's Dower. Two days later, Nelly signed an agreement witnessed by A. J. Hilton, William Hensley, W. T. Denison and John H. Hilton in which she accepted 40 acres on the north bank of the river and on both sides of the Blue Springs Creek. Thirty-three acres appear to be immediately south of the original Hensley grant and include a cabin in which an Anderson Hensley was living. The dower land was to be hers for her lifetime.

--- an article of agreement, 10 October 1884, in which Elbert S. Hensley gave John H. Hilton full possession of all the land "he now lives upon except the house and barn and binds himself to give full possession of all the buildings before March 1, 1885". This was probably either widow's Dower, or perhaps part of Peter's estate:

On 20 April, 1885, John H. Hilton made the only purchase he ever made directly from one of the original Peter heirs. A deed from Susan Hensley, of Owen Co, Indiana, a daughter of John Peter, gave John H. Hilton 4 acres of land on both sides of the river for \$25.

Dear Mr. Norris:

Finally I start a letter to you and first let me give you Jim Brown's address before I forget - James S. Brown, Jr., 210 Edward St., Kingsport, TN 37665. The last time I wrote I did not get a reply, hope you do.

Now, in looking at your chart I have several questions - you show John A. Hensley as born in Pittsylvania Co., Va. in 1804. If he is the son of Fielding and Nancy then he wasn't born in Pitts. Co. Fielding Hensley received land warrant #20702 in 1783, also others, and lived in Washington Co., Va. until Scott was cut off. He is shown as paying taxes in Wash. Co. in 1788 and in 1815 in Scott Co. I am wondering if possibly Fielding instead John A. was born in Pitts. Co. I have never been able to definitely say where he might have been born but do know there was an earlier Fielding Hensley in Buckingham Co., Va. I believe if the parents of Fielding could be found several puzzles might be solved. For one, he apparently gave land to an Agness Hensley in Scott Co. and later she lived with a Henry Darnell family. Henry's wife was Hannah R. Hensley - she is one of my puzzles too. I am guessing that she might be the daughter of a Wm. Hensley who might be a brother of My Hannah Hensley. Guesses, Geusses.

Or

Someplace in my notes I have information that Isom Hensley's father was Isomor Isham Hensley Sr. I believe it was from an early tax list of Tenn. and it was obvious that Isom, born ca 1799, could not have been a taxpayer at that time. Will keep an eye open for it.

In your letter you mention that Addie Fletcher Heck (Fielding) is still living. Do you know anything about the Fielding, I am assuming that Fielding was her maiden name. I have always felt that Fielding Hensley was named for someone in a Fielding family and if we could find the connection it might tie some loose ends together. There has to be a reason for the various Fielding Hensleys.

I am reading Scott County Deeds, just finished Deed Book 3 and will order more as soon as I get to the library. In Book 3, page 24, 20 April 1824 - Fielding Hensley to John S. Martin, 50 acres on North Fork of Holston River, 67 acres granted to Hensley in 1798 - Fielding in this deed was acting as an administrator of an estate. (it goes on) pay unto Samuel Cornett, Roger Cornett, James Thomas and John Brown, the several heirs of Wm. Cornett deceased, the sum due each will appear from a commissioners report filed in Scott County Clerk's office made on a settlement with the said Hensley, he being the administrator of the said Wm. Cornett deceased. Hensley to get 5% for handling.

Have you run across the Cornetts in connection with Hensleys - I have a copy of a story put together of Hensleys and Godseys and when I began to check on it I found that a Wm. Godsey married Agness Hensley (not the one above) and Agness had a sister Milly Cornett who was present when they were married - I wonder if Fielding is a brother of Agness and Milly. If you would like to read the story I will lend it to you.

Must close and get started on supper.

Good Morning -

Our letters keep crossing in the mail and I decided to wait until I heard from you again before writing but couldn't wait with what I just found. At the courthouse here in Tampa we had a small museum and research room and in it are books and film on the southern states but mostly on Florida and Alabama and Georgia. There are some on N. C., Ky. and Va. I spend usually 2 days a week there as hostess and recently dug up some Va. Marriage records on film that were stuck in the back of a drawer. I have been going over them to see what is there - they are not complete. Someone working on their family had ordered them years ago and then donated them. In there I found the following:

Pittsylvania County - (these are bonds)

Coleman Bruce to Elizabeth R. Swinny - 25 Nov. 1823 - James Swinny, father.

Coleman H. Bruce to Jane Roach - 22 April 1816 - Burdett Roach (did not designate whether bondsman or father)

Benjamin Hensley to Eleanor Hampton - 22 March 1786 - (reg) (I don't know just what reg. signifies)

John H. Hensley to Coley J. (or I) Bruce - 18 August 1834 - Jane Hedrick mother of Coley.

Taliaferro Hensley to Diademy Gorman - 21 Jan. 1799 - by David Nowlin.

I am beginning to think that someone picked up the wrong John Hensley as a ~~XXXXXX~~^{son} for Fielding Hensley unless for some reason John had gone back there.

On the above marriages I am wondering if the Coley could maybe Coley Jane and called Jane.

Dear Mrs Muench

Thank you very much for taking time from your busy schedule to reply to my query in the Holston Pathfinder. I have enclosed some work-sheets on the HENSLEY - PANNEL(L) families which were the subject of that notice.

Our interest in the Hensley surname originated from a statement made by Charles Lawrence Fletcher (my wife's father) some years ago to the effect that he, 'had two Hensley grandmothers which so far as is known, were not related to each other.' You were certainly correct in saying that Nancy F. Hensley (wife of James D. Fletcher) was a daughter of Ison and Jane Hensley. The 1850 VA. Census for Scott Co., substantiates this. My information base was from an 1980 extract note which has since been corrected. The 1850 Scott Co. (Va) Mortality Schedule reads —

'Ison Hensley = 78 Years = male = widowed = died September.'

(See Page 192 line f) In answer to your question about James D. Fletcher's marriage - he had only one wife, his granddaughter, Addie Fletcher Heck (Fielding), who lives still in Anderson, S.C., verifies this. We also have a photograph of James and Nancy taken after 1910 and their family bible record, so we are pretty clear about this. Perhaps it might be helpful if you could provide the address of Jim Brown, your correspondent in Kingsport, Tenn. I would like to write to him about this. (The James D. Fletcher Family Group Sheet enclosed.)

We are also grateful for your information on John Wesley Pennel(I) and his wife Mary Jane Hensley. We have oral history - death certificates, pictures and a few facts from public records only. The name of Mary Jane Hensley's grandparents were not known and John Pennel's mother's family name was not decipherable on the Wise Co, Va. death certificate - we now have corrected "Beach---rd" to read "Beachguard" - so you can see that your letter was of considerable help.

John W. Pennel was a Free Will Baptist Preacher who spent his later years in Wise Co, Va near Norton (Esserville) where he ran a grocery store - both he and Mary J. are buried in a poorly kept public cemetery near Esserville and their graves are identifiable by her stone.

With so little Hensley material to work from I am not able to contribute anything definitive for your Hensley search. A few items from my Misc file on Hensley are enclosed but they may be things already known to you. I am interested in locating a copy of Mrs Annie Walker Burnes - volume titled - Hensley Family Records & Allied Families mentioned in the query of Mrs Bruce Morrow (see enclosure). The other items included are self explanatory.

Please forgive my delay in answering your kind letter. I seem to get bogged down in so many things that I often fail to do what it ought to do in a timely manner.

Since my January 28th letter to you about the Hensley family, I have found a copy of that Annie Walker Burns (Chucy Kate McGhee) booklet in the Genealogical-History collection of my local library at Roanoke. With only a chance to go thru it once briefly, I was unable to locate anything which seemed to directly concern either your or my own Hensley lines. Closer examination may turn up some clues which I missed.

The principal line Mrs Burns sought began with a LEWIS HENSLEY, b. N.C. ca 1782. He married Nancy, dau. of Samuel Howard, in Knox Co., Ky., 1 Sept. 1803.

Hensleys settled first on Cumberland River when the state of Ky. was "an untracked wilderness", the principal settlers having come from N.C. according to oral history but they are said to have been earlier resident in Virginia.

The mimeographed collection of general Hensley ^{material} consists of an unrelated assortment of documents and extracts from public records from Va., N.C., Tenn. & Ky in the east plus items from places where many of these (Mo-Ark-Te) people went in later years. It makes no attempt to sort out the various items & thus could be an interesting and tantalizing source of study for one associated with Hensley family. At least one part of this family lived in the famous "Hensley Settlement" on the Cumberland Mtus of Harlan Co., Ky. near Middlesboro and the Cumberland Gap used by emigrants going into Kentucky from Va & Tenn.

= Are you familiar with the magazine: The Southwest Virginian? Among the many similar publications I have seen this is, in my view, one of the best for someone seeking data on families associated with its area of coverage. See copy of masthead enclosed. The James Hensley material enclosed is taken from this magazine.

= One item of Hensley trivia is found in following note.

" " " for May 1979 - Kingsport, Tenn. and surrounding counties Va. & Tenn. - 106 in Tenn (Sullivan) 46 in Scott Co, Va.

= Have you tried to determine the origin of the Hensley name as a patronymic? I have found suggestions that some refer to it as "local of Hensley" but it does not seem to be very common. Another suggests that it is derived thru "Henley" = Hen - ley (ley = field) thus suggests "Old Field" ?? The best source found was

"Hensley (Eng.) One who came from Henley (high wood or clearing, or one frequented by wild birds) the name of several places in England" - (see below pg 4)

"Hensel - Henschel - Hentschel - Hensle, Hensel = a descendent of little Hans, a pet form of Johannes (Gracious gift of Jehovah)

(P. 94) : ibid - "Hensley" Dweller in the wood frequented by wild birds

- The Hentschel forms suggest Germanic origins also. In this regard Mrs Annie Walker Burns notes a query from the Virginia Genealogist, Vol 6. page 140 by a Mrs Capitolo Glesner, of 200 Hawthorn Springs, Ark.

"Am told that when Hensley family first settled after coming to America, the name was Von Hensley (or) Henslee. Some claim to be of German, some Jewish. the name changed after first generation in colonies." she mentions George W. Hensley, born VA. 1782, - thought to be father of John Hensley, born Tenn, 1829, who married Lena McRee. 1854/55. She was dau. of Massey M. McRee, born Tenn., 1806. Claims Hensleys related to Holliday's & Brewers.

Said John Hensley cousin of Jesse James, the outlaw, James's mother Zerilda Cole of Ky. John Hensley had a sister named Zerilda also.

(ibid) Wm Madison Hensley - Grandson of old Rev. War Soldier and 5th son of family of 9 children, born to Jacob & Betsey (Collins) Hensley. Jacob b. Green Co., Tenn, 9-7-1803. Moved 1868 to Monroe Co., Ark where resided in 1889. Jacob was son of Christian Hensley, originally

from Shenandoah County, VA. Christian died at Knoxville, Tenn. aged 92 yrs. He and his father came from Germany - with a brother - Jacob fought in the Rev. War.

William Madison Hensley, born in Chatham Co., Ga. on 10 April 1857, and moved with his parents to Ark. at about 10 yrs. of Age.

Going back to the section of this letter on Brit. origins of the Hensley patronymic - Frank Smith; A Genealogical Gazetteer of England - on p. 257 lists the following places

Henley, parish 1559, Suffolk 5 miles north Ipswich - population 305* - located in archdeaconry of Suffolk and diocese of Norwich.

Henley, Cold, chapelry, parish Whitechurch, Hampshire.

Henley Arden, chapelry 1672, parish Wootton Waven ^(Warwickshire) Warws, population 1,214* - archdeaconry and diocese Worcester - Baptist, Non-conformist Eng.

Henley upon Thames, 1558. County Oxford - 23 miles s.e. Oxford. population 3,618* - separate jurisdiction - archdeaconry and diocese Oxford. Baptist, Society of Friends, Independents.

Dear Mrs. Muench

This is a response to questions raised in your letter of 23 Feb. about the Hensley - Pittsylvania connection. Until you raised the question I had not actually done a careful analysis of the chronology of this family. Two entries from Death Records are enclosed which do establish a Pittsylvania Connection, albeit somewhat different from what I have previously stated. Perhaps the real connection may have been through the Bruce Family.

John and Jane Hensley were the parents of John A. Hensley who died at age 19 yrs in Scott Co. on 8 June 1862. He was born in Pittsylvania Co. and in 1843. His mother also died in Scott Co., Va. on 29 Nov. 1866. Her parents were Coleman and Jane Bruce (Spelled 'Coalman' in the record) and her birthplace was Pittsylvania Co. If she was 45 yrs of age when she died she must have been born about 1821.

On this basis John and Jane Hensley were residents of Pitts. Co. at least as early as 1843. when their son John A. was born. The 1850 Census of Scott Co. enumeration of this family indicate a marriage as early as 1836 probably in Pitts. Co. since it was wife's place of residence. She would have been about 15 yrs of age which was common for the times. At least two sons were born before John A. - (James H. & William D.) The 4th child was a daughter, Mary Jane, who became the wife of John Wesley Pannell about 1866, but no marriage record has been found in Scott Co. Mary's death certificate says she was born at Ft. Blackmore, Scott Co. Va. and that she was 66 yrs old when she died. This would place her birth about 1846 and indicate that the family probably moved

from Pittsylvania to Scott Co. sometime between 1843 and 1846. This still leaves the birthplace of the elder John Hensley, (b. about 1804) as an open question. He could be son of Fielding and Nancy Hensley as your information suggests.

Addie Fielding (nee Fletcher) is my wife's aunt. Her 2nd husband was Clifford Fielding, born 31 Aug. 1901 in Colorado. I do not have particulars on his family at this time. She met and married him in Utah where he was a professional engineer. After his retirement they lived in Anderson, S.C. where he died in Dec. 1969. He has 3 children by his 1st wife plus 2 brothers and a sister who live in Provo, Utah still. Some of them are members of the Mormon Ch. so have very likely done some work on their ancestry.

As you can see my Hensley search is still being developed. A lot of checking needs to be done. I have not yet encountered that Cornett connection prior to your mention of it. Will keep it in mind. I want to look closer at Pittsylvania records to see what I can find. Your info. has been great help.

Also thanks for Jim Brown's address.

Obviously you are way ahead of me in your Hensley family search. What you have provided has been of tremendous assistance and provided the details needed to better understand the history of this family, both in England and colonial America. I can't tell you how much I appreciate all you have shared with me. I am certain that none of my wife's family have any understanding of, or knowledge about, this history.
- Your overview of the several Washington County and Tennessee Hensleys has also helped to unscramble some puzzles and pinpointed areas where more work is needed.
- The Fielding Hensley family sheet was especially appreciated. Comments about the 'wrong John Hensley' may be appropriate, but only time can tell for sure, at least it is a point to watch for. Thanks for the Godsey-Hensley tale reproduction - it is very interesting and good to have in the file on Hensley family.
- I most appreciate those Pittsylvania Co. Marriage Bond extracts. The Coleman H. Bruce to Jane Roach of 22 Apr. 1816 and John H. Hensley to 'Coley' J. Bruce of 18 Aug. 1834 are ones I needed but have so far not been able to locate - the others I have found - so you have really helped here!

I am sending all of my Hensley ^{*}Death record extracts made in July 1980 for your files. Previously I have only included the two which closely tied Hensley to Pittsylvania and Scott Co.

Also there are a couple of Hensley Births recorded in this same period but I ran out of time so will need another visit to follow-up. In 1980 Hensley was not my main interest. I hope get back again some time in late April for more.
