Jesse Owen and Samuel pattersen Executors of
this my last will and testament in witness whereof
I the said Samuel pattersen have to this my last
will and testament set my hand and seal the day
and year above written Samuel Pattersen
signed sealed published and declared by the said
Samuel pattersen the testator as his last will and
testament in the presence of us who were present
at the time of signing and sealing these presents
